

Message from Our Lead Pastor

The fruitful ministry of the church and school we enjoy today are tied directly to those who went before us – who had vision, who had boldness, who sacrificed and took risks. They were Jesus-centred and Jesus-loving, and were committed to reaching the next generation of believers.

"...we will tell the next generation the praiseworthy deeds of the Lord, His power, and the wonders He has done. Then they will put their trust in God." (Psalm 78:4, 7 NIV)

At some point the torch was passed to us. This is our time to do for the next generation of believers what the previous generation did for us.

A church is not a building, it is the people who gather and journey together in worshipping and following Jesus Christ. The building or facility where the church gathers, though, is still of great value. It is the place where we encounter God together in community. It's a place where the Gospel is proclaimed and followers of Jesus are discipled.

Aesthetics matter. Our space can have a catalyzing effect in drawing our community in, or it can distract, even repel them. We should never minimize the impact our facilities have on the accomplishment of our mission.



Prayer

Have you ever involved your spouse or your family in giving decisions? If not, this would be a good time to start. If you are single, you might want to talk with a friend. If you have children, this is a great way to teach them about giving and faith.

Message from Our Board Chair

It was a different era when we built the auditorium. The IBM PC had not been released. If you wanted to use a computer, you had to find a mainframe. If you were out and needed to make a phone call, you found a pay phone. The internet was just emerging and if you wanted to research a paper, you found the Encyclopedia Britannica in the library.

It was in that environment that our members took steps to build an auditorium. Rather than provide for incremental growth, they decided it should be sized to meet the needs of the next generation. They planned, worked, sacrificed and gave. They believed in "not equal gifts, but equal sacrifice" and "above and beyond your regular tithe".

Their motivation was not centred on building a great facility. It was centred on making an impact on the next generation for Christ.

So now, thirty five years later, we are once again focused on our auditorium. In some ways, everything is different. Computers are everywhere. If you want to use a computer, you will likely grab your smartphone out of your pocket. If you want to find a restaurant, there's

an app for that. If you want to research a paper, you try Google or Wikipedia. Two-year olds are playing with tablets and think it is normal.

Despite all of these changes, in some ways, our situation remains the same. We have decided that the auditorium should meet the needs of the next generation. We still plan, work, sacrifice and give. We still believe in "not equal gifts, but equal sacrifice" and "above and beyond your regular tithe".

I would encourage you to seek God's will for how you will participate in preparing for our next generation.
